Special Events Coming up Don't miss them

Kingdom Maple Festival is returning to St. Johnsbury on April 22nd. United Community Church will be participating in this year's festival. We will be putting on the pancake breakfast from 8:30—11 am in the Fellowship Hall. We will be offering pancakes and syrup, sausages, juice, coffee, and fruit. All for \$7 which will be going to the "raising the roof" fund (replacement of the north side roof). We are looking for volunteers to help with set up, serving and clean up. .Vermont Conference annual meeting will be held at Grace Church in Rutland on April 28 and 29. The theme for this year is "And Who is My Neighbor." Workshops will be exploring the connections between creation justice, economic justice, environmental justice, and LBGTQ justice. Friday's workshops include Hope Fund Applications, Global Ministries, Micro churches and Connecting the dots between The Environment, Covid and Community. Saturday's workshops are White Privilege, Climate Change, Blue Collar Ministry, Intergenerational Ministry (led by Pastor Andrew), and Justice and Witness Ministries. The Keynote speaker will be Bill McKibben, author of "he Flag, the Cross, and the Station Wagon", a discussion on what happen to "American patriotism, American faith, and American prosperity." 

Church World Service Depot coming to United Community Church in early May

United Community Church is the northern Vermont/New Hampshire depot for the CWS kits. Churches in our area that have been creating kits throughout the year will be dropping the filled boxes off in early May. We have many items to be assembled into kits and clean-up buckets. Below are the lists of items in each kit. Items can be dropped off at the church during business hours (9 am - 2pm Tuesday through Friday) or call and arrange for another time if the office hours don't fit with your time. Monetary donations are always accepted.

Emergency Clean-up Bucket

- One 5 gallon bucket with resealable lid—
- One 4-8 oz pump spray air freshener
- Four scouring pads
- Seven sponges, assorted sizes, including one large
- One scrub brush
- Eighteen cleaning towels (reusable, like Easy Wipes ®)
- One 50-oz. or two 25 oz bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 12—16 oz. bottle of liquid concentrated household cleaner that can be mixed with water (like Lysol ®)
- One 16-28 oz. bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn ®)
- One package of 48-50 clothes pins
- Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- Five dust masks
- Two pairs of non-surgical, non-latex gloves
- One pair work gloves (cotton with leather palm or all leather)
- 24-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags (remove roll from box)
- One 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellant (drops or lotion)

Please purchase all liquids in plastic bottles. Be sure to send all new, unopened materials.

Health Kit—

- One hand towel (approx.15" X 28" to 16"X32")
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb (removed packaging)
- One fingernail or toenail clipper (removed packaging)
- One bath size bar of soap (in original packaging)
- One toothbrush (in original packaging)
- Ten standard size Band-Aids

Seal all items in a 1-gal. zipper closing plastic bag

School Kit

- One pair of blunt scissors
- 3 70-count spiral or tape-bound pads of 8-1/2" X
 11" ruled paper or pads with 200 210 sheets of paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler (12")
- One hand-held pencil sharpener
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One large eraser, 2-1/2"
- One box of 24 crayons

One 12" X 14" to 14" X 17" finished size cotton cloth bag with cloth handles Pack these items in the cloth bag and secure contents with the closure.




