A great joy as I have been settling in is the wonderful response I have received in the community as I have sought opportunities to get to know St. Johnsbury. I want to share my gratitude and excitement for the numerous ways we are a part of the community in new ways.



Here are some of the ways I am involved in our St. Johnsbury community as a representative of our congregation:

NEKCA Board of Directors President

In November I began my service on the Board of Directors for Northeast Kingdom Community Action. In January I was elected President of the Board by the other members. I am thankful for this opportunity to collaborate with this incredible community partner. I am further thankful as a newbie in town to have this opportunity to support so many people doing incredible work and to learn more about our town and our region.

Drug Use Prevention Coalition

I have been invited to serve as the religious representative on this collaborative committee that includes the health department, our hospital, drug recovery programs, and other community partners. We all know this is a challenge in our area that affects many of our neighbors and those they love. I am thankful to be able to offer spiritual support and insights to those offering important services.

Young Adult Group

In January we launched our new Young Adult group designed for people 40 ish and younger who are hoping to make social and professional connections. Emilie Begin who works at the St. Johnsbury Academy has been a wonderful partner in helping me get this group going. We will continue to meet every third Wednesday of the month from 4:30pm-6:30pm at Three Ponds in Danville, who is our gracious host.

Town of St. Johnsbury Inclusivity Ordinance

In November the Select Board passed an inclusivity ordinance to offer protections for vulnerable persons and groups. I am currently convening a small working group working to help implement the ordinance and engage the community in the process.

In addition to these ways of being involved in the community I continue to be in conversations with the leaders of The Hub, Umbrella, Northern Vermont University, Discover St. Johnsbury, and the St. Johnsbury Academy about how I as our Pastor and we as the congregation can be supportive and involved.

We are blessed with an incredible and talented community filled with people who are passionate about social justice and are led by compassion for others. I look forward to how God will continue to guide us to be a special part of St. Johnsbury and the Northeast Kingdom. Blessings,

Spiritual Formation & Nurture





Apartments





One Great Hour of Sharing

For over 70 years, the One Great Hour of Sharing offering (OGHS) has been helping American and Canadian Christians bring God's hope and healing to hurting people both in the US and around the world. Since the closing years of WWII, OGHS has raised funds to support domestic and international development, fight poverty and its consequences, and bring aid and relief to communities torn by war or ravaged by natural disaster. Each year, the offering is gathering by several denominations under a sing theme. This year the theme is "It's time to Share..." Through grants OGHS helps organizations confront food insecurity and hunger. They also partner with other groups to provide immediate aid to those affected by disasters, overty or fleeing conflect—providing food, water, shelter, and companionship during times of distress. Financial gifts also enable the

building and rebuilding of structures and processes that make a difference for the future, providing education and helping hands for long-term improvements. OGHS gifts allow families to plant crops, produce fertilizers and receive the physical seeds needed for planting. Education on the practices of irrigation and sustainable farming techniques are taught as well as food and nutrition, hygiene, waste management and environmental protection.

Use the BINGO card to make your contribution. Decide on an amount for each square; every time you do the activity in the square, "X" it out and put that amount in a coin bank. When you have finished "blacking out" all the squares, bring your coin bank or the equivalent to church labelled OGHS. Have fun playing.
