


Pastor's Ponderings



"The Church is not a building"; however ...

I pray that I do not suffer from an "edifice complex". I know that God would bless our worship whether we met in a storefront, in a tent or in our "cathedral" on the hill. I also know that our most important ministry is the ministry each of us does in the community, outside the walls of the building. Nevertheless, there are multiple ministries that we are able to provide because we have our building at 1325 Main Street. The ministry of space for community and family gatherings, support groups, and wider church missions only

happens because we have the space available. The ministry of physical and spiritual nourishment through meals and fellowship occurs because people give of their time and talents, and also because of our remodeled kitchen and dining area. Our extensive ministry of music occurs through our majestic organ and extended set of handbells; and also through providing rehearsal and performance space for our musicians as well as musicians from the wider community. Our ministry of outreach includes activities in our large yard and participation in Main Street events including the Pet Parade, Haunted Sanctuary and Kingdom Maple Festival breakfast. In addition to providing a foundation for all these ministries, our building serves as a Main Street landmark for this community.



We spend a lot of time talking about how to preserve our financial endowment while also exercising good stewardship in its use. We should also recognize that our building is a physical endowment given to us by our forebearers. Preserving and exercising good stewardship of our physical endowment is an act of grace and gratitude for the sacrifices of previous generations. I hope that United Community Church never has to choose between preserving our financial and our physical endowments or that stewardship of one necessitates sacrifice of the other.

Of course, the building only provides the framework and opportunity for our ministries. It is the people – our congregation and staff - who fill these ministries and our building with life and purpose. "You are the church. We are the church together;" and Yes, we could provide some of these ministries in another location. Your generous contributions of time, talent and finances allow us to use our "cathedral" on the hill to provide all these ministries and more. I believe the cloud of witnesses who provided us with this building are happy to see that it is alive and overflowing with ministry.

This past month has been a chance for us to review our actions of the past year. We were pleased to put together 37 school kits, 47 hy-

giene kits, and 20 clean-up buckets. Our depot (8 churches in northern Vermont and New Hampshire) sent 284 school kits, 446 hygiene kits, and 20 clean-up buckets weighing a total of 1336 lbs. to the CWS warehouse to be distributed to disaster areas. 

We brought in \$1070.00, and about \$700 will go to our roof fund!

Based on the numbers you've sent me, these are my estimates:


People hours: 125 volunteer hours

Thanks to generous supporters like you, CWS distributed over 228,000 kits and

Blankets in 2022! Distributed to those in need were 45,570 school kits; 7,843 Baby kits & Welcome Backpacks; 108,390 Hygiene kits, 6,605 cleanup buckets; and 59,910 blankets. Your donation to the CWS Tools program empowers families and communities. Viable communities are being built using tools for such trades as carpentry, plumbing, and tailoring. Gardening tools and materials help to build vegetable gardens and also begin livelihoods such as beekeeping. Clean and safe water dams are being built to trap seasonal rains for year-round use by families and communities



CWS Picks Up Kits

May 10th was pick up day for the Church World Service depot here at United Com-



munity Church. The CWS eighteen wheeler backed into our parking lot from Main Street giving the students walking home from school a treat. The driver and his passenger easily collected the boxes and clean up buckets from the narthex of the church.

They wheeled them down the stairs with a dolly and loaded them into the truck. They have a special dolly for the clean up buckets. Within 20 minutes, they had loaded the boxes with 284 school kits, and 446 hygiene kits, and the 20 clean-up buckets weighing a total of 1336 lbs., and were on their way to Bow, New Hampshire to pick up from that depot. Outreach wants to thank all who donated items from the "eggs" and those who helped put the kits together and pack them in the boxes. Leaving off boxes of kits were representatives from 7 other churches in Northern Vermont and New Hampshire (Bradford





Congregational Church, 1st Congregational Church of Haverhill, Greater Harford, UCC, Newbury Congregational Church, Peacham Congregational Church, United Congregational Church of Orford, and Bethany Congregational Church of Pike, NH). This mission project is a year round project, so as you see items on sale, don't hesitate to purchase them and bring them to church. We have several shelves put aside to hold items as they come in.

Mission Recognitions at Vermont Conference Annual Meeting

Each year at the Vermont Conference Annual Meeting, churches are recognized for their contributions to "Our Church's Wider Mission" and those churches who are 5 for 5. This year, United Community Church received certificates as a 2022 OCWM Church, and a 2022 5 for 5 church. The later means that we have donated towards the 5 special offerings of the United Church of Christ (Neighbors in Need, Strengthen the Church, One Great Hour of Sharing, Christmas Fund [Veterans of the Cross], and Our Church's Wider Mission). New this year is the "Hope Fund for the Future," a special fund created by the Vermont Conference. We were also recognized for contributing to that also.
