• Visioning: Significant time during our monthly Council meetings has been devoted to visioning with Pastor Andrew. • Nominating: A nominating committee of church members has been formed to develop a slate of officers and Ministry members for the next year. This slate will be voted at Annual Meeting in May and will be responsible for moving the church's vision forward for FY'24 and beyond. Nominating committee members are seeking to match individual gifts and talents with the needs of each Ministry or office. When you are asked by a member of the nominating committee to serve on a Ministry or as an officer, please know that you have been specifically chosen for your unique talents and prayerfully consider accepting the invitation to serve.

For over 70 years, the one Great Hour of Sharing Offering also known as Week of Compassion, has been helping American and Canadian Christians bring God's hope and healing to people both in the US and around the word. OGHS has raised funds to support domestic and international development, fight poverty and its consequences, and bring aid and relief to communities torn by war or ravaged by natural disasters. OGHS helps organizations confront food insecurity and hunger. They partner with other organizations to provide immediate aid to those affect by disasters, poverty or fleeing conflict. OGHS provides food, water, shelter, and companionship during times of distress. They also support soup kitchens and food pantries.

Besides immediate aid, OGHS allows families to plant crops, produce fertilizers and receive the physical seeds needed for planting. They also teach women and men the practices of irrigation and sustainable farming as well as teaching about food and nutrition, hygiene, waste management and environmental protection.

Esmerelda Robies lives in rural Honduras. She and her neighbors participate in a "pass chain" program. A family receives a pregnant pig, sheep or cow; families are taught how to feed and care for the animals. When the next piglet, lamb, or calf is born, it is passed on to another family which in turn will do the same. "A dream we have as a family is to have a micro-business for the production and sale of meat," Esmerelda says. Families now envision a future not possible before. This is just one part of a program to improve food security. This program and its components are made possible because of your contributions to One Great Hour of Sharing.




